| ADVANCED TEE TIMES |

You can register for a tee time 7 days in advance. Visit or call the Golf Pro Shop at 706-687-1940.

Organized groups of 12 or more who play on a continuing basis can obtain tee times in advance by coordinating with the Director of Golf .

| DRESS CODE |

Personnel desiring to play golf or practice at this facility must wear appropriate golf attire which is in good repair and worn as the manufacturer intended for the clothing to be worn. Shirts must be worn at all times. Gentlemen must wear shirts with sleeves. Ladies may wear sleeveless shirts that provide proper coverage. Soldiers on duty may hit range balls in their ACUs.

Tank tops, muscle shirts, ball jerseys , halter tops, mesh type or see through clothing, gym shorts, cut offs, bathing suits. P.T. uniforms or any other items of the military uniform, bagging/sagging pants or under garments visible are examples of apparel deemed improper. Do-rags or



or handkerchiefs, skull caps are not proper headwear.

Non-metal spike golf shoes or smooth rubber sole type shoes are allowed. The only shoe above the ankle allowed is a tennis style shoe. Boots are not permitted on the golf course or putting greens.

CHILDREN DRESS RESTRICTIONS (ages 4-13): Children 13 and under may wear T-shirts provided they are neat, clean and tucked in.

WINTERTIME CLOTHING: Long sleeve collarless shirts may be worn, i.e., turtlenecks, mock turtlenecks, etc., and fashionable sweatshirts. Sweat clothing of any kind is not allowed.

| SUPERVISION OF PLAY |

The Director of Golf, assistant managers, starters, members of the Golf Advisory Council, and others designated will serve as marshals for the purpose of enforcing course rules and maintaining order. Their judgment will prevail. Each has the authority to require slow groups to speed up play if they are delaying groups behind them, or to remove any player from the course for cause, such as unsportsman-like conduct, failure to have a membership or greens fee tag, or to provide proof of authorization to play on the course.

| GOLF ADVISORY COUNCIL |

Golfers of the Fort Benning community will be represented by a Golf Advisory Council. In accordance with Army Regulation 215-1 and as addressed in Appointment Orders of the Fort Benning Golf Advisory Council by the Fort Benning Chief of Staff, the Council will consist of representatives from active duty military units assigned to Fort Benning, Department of Defense civilians, retired officers, Ladies Golf Association, along with the Golf Course Business Managers, Course Superintendent, and Chief of Business Operations Division. The Council will make recommendations on the activities, services and facilities desired by the golfers. The chairperson shall appoint standing committees necessary to serve the golfers. The Council will meet at least every eight weeks or when called by the chairperson. Minutes of the Golf Advisory Council meetings will be prepared and staffed through Director, Family and Morale, Welfare and Recreation, approved by the Garrison Commander, and posted on the bulletin board in the clubhouse.



| CHILDREN |

Children under the age of 4 are not permitted on the golf course but may under the direct supervision of an adult be on the practice putting green and driving range. The adult must ensure the child(s) is not interfering with other golfers.

Children between the ages of 4 and 12 will be under adult supervision while on the premises.

| GENERAL INFORMATION |

All golfers must sign in at the Pro Shop prior to playing.

The rules of golf as developed by the United States Golf Association and amended by local rules will govern play on the course.

Each player must have a set of clubs. (The Director of Golf may make an exception when rental clubs are not available or special events are being conducted.)

Practice is limited to designated practice areas, driving range, putting green behind the clubhouse, and practice area right on the #1 Fairway on the Marshall Nine. (Practice is free except for cost of range balls.)

Range balls will not be removed from driving range.

During heavy use periods (tee times); twosomes and singles may not begin play without express consent of the Director of Golf or his starter. Fivesomes may play Monday-Friday only, except on holidays; however, exceptions must be granted from the Director of Golf based on playing conditions.

| MOTORIZED CARTS |

- Will be kept at least 60 feet from front of green and in rough around green or behind red lines where available.
- Will be kept on paths around tees.
- Will not go between greens and traps.
- Only two sets of clubs per cart.
- Will be kept out of wet areas.
- Ninety degree rule is always in effect.
- No one under the age of 16 is authorized to drive a cart.
- The use of privately owned golf carts is prohibited.

Players who present official handicap parking permits, as required by law, will be given a special flag and may drive golf carts to within 30 feet of the green with Pro Shop permission.

Players leaving #9 green must go directly to the next tee or lose their turn on the course.

Club tournaments for active duty military personnel in



support of the Army Golf program take precedence over individual play.

On-post units or activities may schedule special tournaments with the Director of Golf. A written request is required 14 days prior to the tournament.

The pavilion and clubhouse may be rented for catering events. The Director of Golf will maintain the calendar or schedule of events.

Catering is available through the Benning Conference Center, Golf 19th Hole, or any Family and Morale, Welfare and Recreation activity. All other caterers are required to pay a per person fee.

| RIDING CARTS |

When riding carts are rented, they are rented for one or two riders, for 9 or 18 holes. All cart fees must be paid prior to play and if you plan to play more holes, the cart fees are due before you start your extra holes. All riding carts are due in at least 10 minutes prior to darkness. At no time will there be two single carts in the same group. The person who signs for rental of the cart is responsible for payment of any damages to it.

Annual memberships are available October-September annually. See the Director of Golf for rates and benefits.
